FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE INSTRUCTIONS BELOW WILL RESULT IN AUTOMATIC REJECTION OF THE ABSTRACT.

Abstracts will be by paperless electronic abstract submission only at the following address:

By submitting the paper, the first author is agreeing to register and present, if selected, at the SARS Annual Meeting 2012 in Nottingham.

The work described in the abstract must conform to acceptable ethical standards. When appropriate, please make a statement with regard to ethical committee or Home Office approval for any clinical and/or animal experiments described in your abstract.

PLEASE follow these instructions when typing your abstract

1. Please type the TITLE of the abstract in CAPITALS.
2. Do not indicate the centre from which the work emanates as the abstracts will be judged anonymously.
3. The permitted abstract length is 250 words and should fit comfortably on a single page of A4. All text must be typed in **single line spacing** using **font Ariel 10**.
4. Please divide the abstract into the following four headings:
 - **Introduction**
 - **Methods**
 - **Results**
 - **Conclusions**
5. You must include data with clear descriptions of results and conclusions.
6. All abbreviations must be defined at the foot of the abstract. Please avoid the excessive use of abbreviations.
7. Do not use references.
8. Do not include graphs, figures or tables.
9. If the first author of the paper is a trainee at the time of submission, the paper is eligible for the "Patey Prize".
10. The work must not have been previously submitted to SARS.
11. All co-authors of the paper must be aware of the submission.

ABSOLUTELY NO LATE SUBMISSIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED**
